I must say it always saddens me when i hear from someone like yourself. I think it is so unfair to have to live your life worry about what your family thinks. It is bad enough that you have society to deal with but having to face the same issues with family is a double blow. Every family is different and reacts to gay issues in different ways. I think you have one advantage that most who experience difficulty with family does not. You know that you did not CHOOSE to be gay. You are very clear that it is just the way you are. With that attitude you need to be strong in your belief when you are with your family. I am not saying go out of your way to make them uncomfortable but do not back down or hide who you are. Most people will always be uncomfortable with things they do not understand. I think it is not until you have to face it first hand

that you will ever find comfort. It is your job to help your family realize that you are the same person whether gay or straight. You need to be natural in what you do and let them see that being gay is just as normal as being straight. Do not be ashamed to talk about the same sex person you met just as you would the opposite sex person if you were straight. I think if you talk to your parents about dating and not hide it from them it will slowly but surely bring them to the realization that being gay is not going away.

I think parents are so affected because they think a gay child will cause them to miss the one on one conversations about who you love and what is so great about that person. You must show your parents that you will still be the same responsible person and that you do indeed value their opinion. They may or may not like the person you are with but that happens whether you are gay or straight. What I am trying to say to you is inclusion is the key. Do not exclude your parents or other family members from what is going on. They may scream at first and pretend they do not want to talk about it but that is normal behavior for people experiencing something new. Stand tall and firm in who you are and share it with those who really love you. You may not feel the love but trust me its there. Talk to each family member separately and let them know how much you love them and want them to love you back unconditionally. You will be surprised at what including them in your life completely will accomplish Let me know how it goes.



Leather Care Tips

The following information explains how leather is made and the best ways to keep your leather looking its best for years to come. We want you to be educated when purchasing leather as a consumer.

Do not use saddle soap, solvents, abrasives or caustic household cleaners such as soap or dish detergent. Avoid using cleaning fluid, shoe cream, and mink oil. These products contain ingredients that may damage leather. These vary widely in strength and in compatibility with today's water-

based leather finishes, and may cause cracking or other damage to the leather surface. Direct sources of heat and extended exposure to direct sunlight may also be harmful to the leather and should be avoided. Remember that leather cleaners have the proper cleaning ingredients to get the job done right but will dry the hide out; all you have to do is use neats foot oil. This will keep it from drying out and cracking. Remember to also do this right before winter, as this season is very hard on any kind of leather.

Wax

Place ice cubes in plastic bag over wax until it becomes firm enough to gently lift from surface. Treat any residual marks as grease.

Gum

Gently heat with hair dryer. Use clean white cloth to rub gum from surface onto cloth. Treat any residual marks as grease.

Blood/Urine

Flush from leather with clear water and soft cloth.

Finished Leather: Clean with OLD Soft Cotton Tee –shirt and Lexol Leather Cleaner, then treat with Lexol Conditioner and Protector.

Aniline Leather: Dry slowly away from direct heat.
