





Pride Parades all over the nation.
People look forward to hearing the initial roar of the engines because it boldly announces that "WE ARE HERE AND WEAREQUEER!" which I believe is the essence of what pride is all about. The motorcycles at the beginning of the parade is a powerful statement, far more powerful that any current political issue.

Political agendas will always be a part of gay pride and I personally feel that we as the Gay community should be fighting for civil rights for everyone, not just legal marriage for Gays and Leshians. My concern is that in our attempt to make a political statement, we risk losing the tradition of what the Pride Parade is all about and the positive reputation we have demonstrated. particularly to the City of Madison. Fortunately, Dykes on Bikes and the Madison Pride Committee have come up with a compromise so that the political agenda will be highlighted withour losing the tradition of Dykes on Bikes involvement at the start of the parade. Dykes on Bikes has agreed to augment our role in the parade for this year only and Madison Pride is working with the Madison Police Department to protect us all from any liability should parked cars or unruly pedestrians get in the way of the parade.

However, some changes have not been so cooperative. For example, Dykes on Bikes lost their role in leading off Milwaukee's Pridefest

Parade last year and so for this year. there has been no contact from Milwaukee requesting Dykes on Bikes involvement at all. We do not believe that these are the kind of changes that will enhance the Gay and Leshian community. Gay traditions are few and Dykes on Bikes leading Pride parades is a tradition that we all should work on protecting. Our parades demonstrate our acceptance of diversity which includes gay families. The following is a quote from the home page of Pride Fest Milwaukee. It was written by two women with two children to celebrate diversity for all

"FACES OF PRIDE"—"Pride is a place for people to be proud of what is important to them! Pride means being proud of whom we are, and Pride Fest is a place for people to be proud of what's most important to them. We take our family to Pride Fest because we want to teach our kids to be proud of themselves and to be proud of our lamily," If people don't come out this year of all years, the Constitutional Amendment (banning gay marriage) will turn back the clock We need people to be proud, be brave, or we will lose our rights."

SO, LET'S ALL GET OUT THERE AND VOTE IN NOVEMBER TO PROTECT OUR CIVIL RIGHTS. AND LET'S ALL. REMEMBER THAT WE'RE MISSING THE POINT IF WE DON'T FOCUS ON PRIDE.

Leather Bound by Toby Sigle

The focus this month is on Gay Pride!
And what better time to focus on
Pride than during the preparation of
our annual Pride Parade in Madison
and Pride Fest in Milwaukee. This
year is a particularly important year
to participate since we are all going to
be effected one way or another
if the ban on gay marriage is passed in
next November's election.

Change is an inevitable part of life and I would like to remind everyone to view change with a discerning eve when it comes to breaking our gay traditions. Here in Madison, there was initially a proposal to exclude Dykes on Bikes from leading the Pride Parade on July 9 and instead to function as honor guards. Madison Pride shared with us that their plan is to have families and children lead the parade this year to highlight the current political movement in favor of Gay marriage. The plan of having families with children lead the parade had the expectation that the media would most likely focus on the families rather than the traditional focus on the leather community, drag queens and other flamboyant characters. Our concern was that the community at large could view these families leading our parade as our desire to become

just like straight people. It could appear to the straight community that we are NOT proud of our diverse and often colorful community. In fact, we could also be giving our own community the message that butches, drag kings, drag queens or anyone else that doesn't look "normal" need not apply at all.

Dykes on Bikes were a part of the original Stonewall Warriors in 1968 who started the gay rights movement. The San Francisco contingency of Dykes on Bikes began a exciting tradition that spread to cities throughout the world. Our presence is vital in communicating Gay Pride Additionally, Dykes on Bikes have been Madison Pride's biggest supporters for years. In fact, we usually have more motorcycles than people walking in the parade! And I believe that our motorcycles leading off the parade should never be compromised because it robs our own community of its tradition and symbol of pride.

As President of Dykes on Bikes since 1981, I personally know that Dykes on Bikes Madison has an extremely long history of leading the Madison Pride Parade. In fact, Dykes on Bikes has a long tradition of leading October we gather at the corner of North Hamilton and North Pinckney Streets (across from the YWCA) to gather signatures of people who are opposed to the ban on civil unions and marriage.

Many people are not even aware that the ban will be on the ballot this. November, so in addition to gathering signatures, we also spread the word about the ban to farmer's market visitors who may not have heard about the ban or its far-reaching effects.

Come with a smile and we'll provide you with training, petitions, a clipboard and a pen. We request that volunteers help out for a minimum of 2 hours. Many of our volunteers who help at this event come back every single Saturday. Maybe you'll want to too!

pretty good (TAYLOR HICKS' 'Taking It to the Streets' and MANDISA'S 'I'm Every Woman'), some are pretty average, and a few are songs you might like a time or two and quickly go tired of. For example, MCPHEE'S voice is amazing, but she has a pronounced tendency to oversing. Her 'Black Horse in the Cherry Tree' would have been a better choice. PICKLER'S song choice fails to impress (her Melissa Etheridge cover was MUCH better than the Patsy Cline song the producers chose here). I would also like to have heard BUCKY COVINGTON'S Tim McGraw cover - 'Real Good Man'

a lot more than 'Superstition'.
 You can't help but like Bucky and
 I wish they'd showcased his

Sure it's hard to be impartial about these singers — after all, we feel like we get to know them when we're watching 'AI'. And the producers REALLY should pick out each singer's BEST performance. Music Review



While Amber's albums are consistently great from start to finish (including

her latest full length My Kind of World), it seems that each of them has one major dance hit that stands above the rest, tears up the charts and dance floor, and just seems to "click" with the right sound, the right lyrics, at the right time, with the right remixes. Just Like That is the one from her latest album to fit that bill, charting the same path as her classic hits like. Sexual and Yes. The mixes from Jason Nevins retain the unique sound of the original album version, adding a bit of guitar and beat to "dance it up." The Belmares & Preve and Solar City vs. DJ Rico radio and anthem remixes are getting the most club play (here in Boston) and really bring the boys to the floor. My personal favorite, however, is the Jeff Barringer "Dancing Club Anthem" mix - an unexplainably ambient but catchy dance mix that you won't be able to get enough of. At the 2 minute mark, this mix kicks into gear on a buoyant and breezy beat that comes together around 6:10 for a finish that'll have you shaking your T&A on the dance floor or

the treadmill. Although her latest full length CD has a darker, more sophisticated sound, this single proves that Amber hasn't strayed too far from the music that has made her a dance floor staple.

While I'm watching American Idol I often find myself rooting for singers I like more than singers who are good. BUT the songs on this CD are best



listened to without the television hoopla, the live audience, and the frenzied absence of rooting
