



Za's, 1106 Main Street, Green Bay, Wisconsin 54301, (800) 578-3785, will host the Miss Gay Great Lakes US of A At-Large Pageant Saturday August 23, 1997 a 10:00 p.m.; Diversions, 1413 Green Valley Road, Neenah, Wisconsin (920) 725-3374, will host the two-day Official Miss Gay Wisconsin US of A Pageant.

The preliminary contest will be held Saturday, October 18, 1997, starting at 7:00 p.m.

Finals will begin at 9:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 19, 1997.

Performers interested in running for the title of Miss Gay Wisconsin US of A Pageant must qualify by winning first place or first runner-up in a preliminary pageant. 



Jess Littleman

interviews Tammy Faye,
 Miss Gay Milwaukee-USofA

Just when I thought I had talked to every title holder between Kenosha and Marinette, I get a call from Quest—"Tammy Faye is on the Cover! We need an interview, pronto!" Shows what I know. I was able to get hold of her at her home in Appleton on that first sweltering hot Monday morning of the year, and we discussed her life in the limelight.

Born in Neenah and a graduate of Menasha High, Tammy Faye is a well-known performer not only in the Fox Valley, but the entire state. After winning the Miss Fox Valley Title, she took Milwaukee by storm and won Miss Milwaukee US of A. I talked to her the other day and found out she was quite active in high school....

Tammy Faye: I was big into choir, drama, music. I played quite a bit of sports, believe it or not: Tennis, bowling, golf...

Jess Littleman: When did you start performing in drag?

TF: It was Turnabout in 1993 at the Pivot Club. I was a bartender there. A prerequisite to work at the bar was to perform in Turnabout every year.

(Note: Turnabout is a benefit show some clubs put on every year for charity. The local queens tend bar while the club staff performs on stage in drag—JL)
 My first number was "Set Me Free" by Clubland. It's actually on video—it's pretty scary!

JL: What was a great moment for you personally while performing onstage?

TF: I had a really great experience from winning Miss Fox Valley. That was the year that Pussy Tourette (of "French Bitch" fame) was the guest entertainer. She was very nice! [She] and I had our picture on the cover of *Quest* that year right after I had won Miss Fox Valley. That was just a good feeling, you know? I had done drag two years before that—that was the first pageant that I won. Then I ran for Miss Wisconsin US of A that year, and I didn't make top ten. That was kind of a disappointment.

JL: What did you perform in Milwaukee to win the title?

TF: I did "River Deep, Mountain High" by Celine Dion.

JL: Are there any performers that you look up to?

TF: I look up to Sage LaRue, Josie Lynn, Loretta LaMour, Brittany Morgan in Milwaukee—she's Miss Gay Milwaukee America right now—I look up to Vicki C, too. [We both] do a lot of comedy stuff. I like variety and so does she. We're kind of similar.

JL: That's cool. Do you style yourself like anyone?

TF: No one person, actually. I've been told I look a lot like Celine Dion.

JL: How do you go about choosing numbers and costumes—the different parts of a performance?

TF: They come to me. I'm not the typical drag queen—I don't do a lot of ballads. I like to do a lot of comedy, a lot of fun things. What I usually do is I listen to the radio; I have tapes made for me by my friends, I listen to music and decide, "I can do that! It's kind of fun!" I want to make the audience enjoy it also. If I don't think they'll enjoy it, then I won't do it. The main thing is I'm an entertainer, and I like to entertain the audience.

JL: How did competing this year in Milwaukee differ from other competitions you've been in?

TF: Well, I took most of last year off from performing. I was dating somebody who was also performing and (pauses) I was made to feel real small as a performer, so I didn't think I could do it anymore. I was told I was getting old.... Then we broke up. I said to myself, "I want to keep doing it!" I started doing shows again. I ran [for Miss Milwaukee] and I won. It proved to myself and everyone else that I'm still capable of running and competing. I feel a lot more confident now, and that's really big thing.

JL: Good! Besides your new-found confidence, what else is new in your life since you won the title?

TF: Well, I'd probably have to say I'm one of the busiest drag queens in Wisconsin! I'm performing somewhere almost every weekend, sometimes twice, three times a weekend. I've done enough for four years! My reputation is [that] I'm very committed to it. I very seldom cancel out on a show. I've been to Eau Claire, down to Milwaukee, and Green Bay—I get as many places as I can.

JL: Do you have any special plans for the remainder of your year?

TF: Well, I'm hoping to make top five at State (Miss Gay Wisconsin Pageant)—realistically, I hope to make top ten, for sure! That is my goal this year at State.

Umm, I don't know. I've pretty much been everywhere in the state. I would like to perform in Minneapolis—I've always wanted to go there. *Tammy Faye also talked about two of the pageant systems that have competitions in Wisconsin.*

TF: I'm happy with the US of A System. I've been approached to run for the America system, and I haven't really taken a look at that yet to see what it's like.

Tammy Faye wishes to thank all of the support she's received from her fans, and her family—her brother and mom are coming to watch her compete later on this year. We at Quest wish her best at State as well. Good Luck!



PAST OUT

July 25, 1979 (18 years ago this week): Gay and lesbian protesters disrupt the New York City filming of "Cruising". What were the Cruising protests?

One of the most provocative and controversial gay-themed films in history, 1980's "Cruising" starred Al Pacino as a rookie New York City cop who goes undercover to investigate a series of killings in the gay leather underworld. During filming in the summer of 1979, hundreds of gays and lesbians who heard that the script was violently homophobic attempted to disrupt filming.

The film's content was first publicized to gays and lesbians by openly gay Village Voice columnist Arthur Bell, who complained that the script he had read showed Pacino increasingly enticed by the sado-masochistic gay life until he becomes both gay and murderous himself (the final version of the film was ambiguous on this point). Bell singled out the film's director, William Friedkin, as particularly homophobic (Friedkin had directed "The Boys in the Band" a decade earlier) and urged gays and lesbians to interrupt the on-location filming in Greenwich Village and protest the film's distributors. Bell later told a reporter that he sparked the protests because "this movie is a message to go out and kill, mutilate, and decapitate gays."

The furious protests against the film - which drew upon members of activist groups like the Gay Activists Alliance as well as the more moderate National Gay Task Force and gays unaffiliated with any group - have to be seen in the context of the time in which they took place. The summer of 1979 was less than two years after Anita Bryant first sparked repeals of gay rights laws across the country, and only half a year after Harvey Milk's murder. Gays and lesbians were particularly sensitive to attacks on their rights and their persons - and "Cruising" was seen as kicking them while they were down.

A few days before filming was scheduled to begin, several hundred gays, lesbians, and supporters gathered in a Greenwich Village Church to plan the "Cruising" protests. During the last week of July and the first week of August, activists protested filming both by day and by night. Loud whistles were blown at key moments, forcing expensive re-takes, and activists handed out flyers calling the film "a genocidal act." One protester charged, "This movie glorifies fag-killing. It's going to encourage violence against gays."

Particularly galling to the protesters were the dozens of gay men who served as extras in the bar scenes of the film, receiving \$60 a day (more if they

were willing to simulate sex acts). Protesters shouted "Judas!" at such extras (who were required to bring their own leather outfits from home), and more than a dozen chose to quit, while others leaked the locations of future shootings to the activists, facilitating future protests.

The "Cruising" protests were effective in other ways - every gay bar in the Village but one closed their doors to the filmmakers, and Friedkin added a brief disclaimer at the start of the film indicating that the characters in the film were not meant to be representative of the gay community as a whole. But the protesters were unable to halt the filming or distributing of "Cruising" - so they started another round of protests when the film was released in February 1980. Several hundred gay and lesbian activists picketed movie theaters in New York City and San Francisco, and there were smaller protests in other cities.

In the wake of the San Francisco protests, Mayor Dianne Feinstein threatened to send a bill totaling more than \$100,000 to United Artists, which distributed the film, for the city's costs in policing the streets during the protests. When the ACLU objected that the mayor's threat represented a prior restraint against free expression, Feinstein backed off. On the other coast, a New York City attorney proposed - also to no avail - that gays file a multimillion-dollar class-action lawsuit against Friedkin for libeling the gay community.

A minority in the gay community defended the film on First Amendment grounds, but almost no one defended the leather lifestyle. The gay and lesbian community of 1980 was greatly concerned that the American public not associate them with sadomasochism and dark, seedy bars - even to the point of assenting to attacks on the leather subculture. The closest thing to a defender of this aspect of the gay community came from pro-pornography author and novelist John Rechy, who penned "A Case for Cruising" in the Village Voice. But even Rechy relied mostly on support for the freedom of speech and wrote only vaguely about a more open "exploitation of our problems."

Despite a strong opening weekend, the film bombed at the box office. Reviews were mediocre at best (Time called it "hopelessly fouled up"), and the film - and the protests - quickly faded. Ironically, however, "Cruising" has enjoyed a revival of sorts in recent years. When the film played for a week at the Roxie in San Francisco in 1995, both of that city's major newspapers ran movie reviews that re-evaluated the film and recommended it strongly.






