


PAST OUT

September, 1955 (42 years ago this month): The Daughters of Bilitis is founded in San Francisco.

Who were the Daughters of Bilitis?

The first lesbian organization in the United States was the Daughters of Bilitis (DOB), which started as a social group of less than a dozen women meeting in members' homes in San Francisco. The group was founded by lovers Phyllis Lyon and Del Martin, who chose name "Daughters of Bilitis" to refer to a French poem set on the Isle of Lesbos entitled "Song of Bilitis." Lyon and Martin felt the name sounded "like any other women's lodge," such as the Daughters of the American Republic.

From its founding in September 1955, the DOB cast itself as an alternative to the lesbian bar scene, which its leaders saw as destructive to the well-being of women who participated in it. One DOB President wrote, "The defiance, disillusionment, and despair, we all know, lie there under the mask of 'gaiety' which [bar patrons] put on!"

Instead, the DOB offered mixers and discussion groups they termed "Gab 'n Javas," in which members would discuss issues such as mental health and "Should lesbians wear skirts?"

But soon the DOB's mission widened into outreach and politics. The main mechanism for outreach was the newsletter *The Ladder*, launched in 1956. Initially distributed to all members plus any lesbian the organizers could think of - not to mention lawyers and psychologists listed in the telephone book - *The Ladder* later gained nationwide circulation through subscriptions and newsstands. As such, it provided a key lifeline to other lesbians for women living in isolated areas. The *Ladder* contained news articles, poetry, fiction, and biographies of famous lesbians from the past.

In 1958 DOB chapters were founded in New York and Los Angeles, followed the next year by a chapter in Chicago and, briefly, Rhode Island. Most of the groups had a strained but cooperative relationship with the male-dominated homophile organizations of the time - the Mattachine Society and ONE. The women of the DOB felt the male groups tended to treat them like a "ladies' auxiliary," and some of the men resented the fact that while their own groups were open to all, the DOB was open only to women. DOB leaders reacted to this situation with a sense of humor, creating a "men's auxiliary" called the Sons of Bilitis - and handing out membership cards to gay and straight male allies that carried the initials "SOB."

The first of the DOB's five biennial conventions was held in San Francisco in 1960. The conference was interrupted by local law enforcement who

demanded to know whether the attendees advocated wearing men's clothing, which was illegal at that time. The irony was that in 1960, the Daughters of Bilitis required its members to wear "appropriate" clothing to activities, and saw as part of its mission as "advocating a mode of behavior and dress acceptable to society." As Barbara Gittings, who later rebelled against the conformist DOB style, described it, DOB members at one national convention persuaded a woman who had worn masculine attire all her life to "deck herself out in as 'feminine' a manner as she could, given that female clothes were totally alien to her. Everybody rejoiced over this as though some great victory had been accomplished - the 'feminizing' of this woman."

This incident illustrates the attitude of the Daughters of Bilitis well into the mid-sixties. Its four-part statement of purpose identified, along with education of the public, participation in research projects, and promotion of legal changes, the "education of the variant ... to enable her to understand herself and make her adjustment to society." On several occasions, psychiatrists and other "experts" who had contempt for homosexuality were invited to speak to DOB events. Even the name of the newsletter implied that the DOB existed to bring lesbians out of a debased state and up "the ladder" of acceptance.

In the mid-1960s, Gittings began to use her position as editor of *The Ladder* to encourage a change in the DOB's stance. She began to use the word "lesbian" on the cover, and wrote columns urging women to come out and criticizing the dependence on medical "experts." Then, in May 1965 she printed a long article by Franklin Kameny, the leader of the most aggressive, outspoken wing of the homophile movement. In his piece, Kameny debunked the "gay is sick" point of view and urged readers to go beyond supporting research into homosexuality's causes and cures and instead focus on "the often less pleasant rough-and-tumble of political and social activism."

By the late 1960s, many members of the Daughters of Bilitis had embraced the feminist critique of American society, and much of the energy of American lesbians was dedicated to the feminist and gay liberation movements. The DOB was so divided between the old guard and the new style that at the 1970 convention the national structure was dissolved, *The Ladder* ceased publication, and the local chapters went their own ways, mostly dissolving within a few years. The Daughters of Bilitis played a crucial role in breaking the ice for lesbian organizing, but its long-standing insistence on conformity and acceptance by mainstream society made it ill-suited for the feminist 1970s.



HOLY HOLY!

It's always been an interesting challenge for me to interview people for this column when I know them personally. I mean, I think I know enough about them that I might not ask anything interesting, or I might not get the responses I had hoped for, familiarity breeding contempt.

I was happy to interview ZA's Bartender Jimmy Nelson, otherwise known as Miss Holly Hot Damn, because this is someone who I like not only as the guy who gives me my drinks strong, but also as the girl who burns up the stage when performing. Most Green Bay patrons will recognize her as one of the performers of the bar's Friday Night Drag Show. She's also the uncontested winner of this year's Miss Gay Green Bay USofA. When I asked her about winning sans competition, she noted she was very happy to represent the city at the State level, but realizes that she has a unique challenge ahead of her. She also sends kudos to the judges for all of their input.

After settling into the Java's Lounge and getting a drink, I started my interview with Holly by asking about her life before the bar.

Holly Hot Damn: I grew up in the Upper Peninsula, in Michigan, graduated Class of '91.

Jess Littleman: Why did you move down to Green Bay?

HHD: Why? Actually, I moved down because of the first guy I started seeing. I wanted to break away anyway, so that gave me the first opportunity to. I was always scared to move; so he gave me a new door to open up in my life.

JL: Did you start bartending at ZA's right away?

HHD: No, actually I didn't. I worked at the CNA for five years--two and a half down here. I always wanted to [tend bar at ZA's]...

JL: Customers seem to really like seeing you behind the bar.

HHD: Well, some do, some don't. A lot of times, I make an ass out of myself behind the bar. They get a kick out of it. I'll say or do something really stupid. I'm personally kind of shy behind the bar, but once I get motivated, once I get people to laugh--maybe buy them a shot or something. A lot of people who come in, I know what they drink, how they want it made, and that works...

There are people that know me [as Jimmy] but don't like me because they like Holly.

JL: Seriously?

HHD: There are people who won't come up to me or talk to me, but when Holly is out--Wham! They're

right there. I think it's kind of funny!

JL: Do you know if there are any people who know you as both but don't realize it's the same person?

HHD: Yes! In the last couple of months there have been a couple of new people that have been coming out who know me and they know Holly, but they've never really connected it. So, somebody that knows me as both will say, "Well, that's Jimmy the bartender!" They'll say "No, shut up!" And then I'll say, "Yeah!" They're really shocked, they'll look and look and look, and I'll say, "Yep--it's me!" For me, it's kind of like a little glory trip for myself.

JL: It means you're doing your job correctly.

HHD: Yeah, apparently! I'm doing something right... when people can't distinguish...

JL: What's coming up for Holly in the future?

HHD: I don't know if I'll be doing this for the next twenty thousand years. What I want right now are the two Green Bay titles, kind of following in my drag mother's footsteps--Miss Kelli Jo Klein. Go for the Green Bay, go for the Emerald City. If I don't get the Emerald City right off the bat next year, I'll keep going for it. After those two titles, I might take a break and go on to performing again just for fun.

I have a couple of shows lined up for the next year that I want to do before I give up my crown.

JL: Did you perform at the NEW Pride Picnic this year?

HHD: I did, but I ended up getting kind of ill! (Laughs) I ended up slashing my number in half. It was the first year I've ever performed outside...

JL: Not, "Outside of the bar"; just plain "OUTSIDE!"


HHD: ...yeah, it was outside, on a hill, in the grass... I've never done that before! I wore thick enough heels, Thank God! I wasn't sinking like all the other queens. I was expecting it to be a little cooler for the picnic. I wasn't expecting the heat. I dressed in all black--black leather jacket, pants--the worst thing I did was getting dressed forty-five minutes before I went on and I just sat in this hot bar. By the time I got to my number, I got halfway through the song, I got dizzy, and thought, "I'm gonna get sick! Cut my song and go!" I could puke out here...

JL: That's one way to make an impression.

HHD: No, no, no, no! (Both laugh)

It's always a pleasure to interview someone that I know, and Jimmy, a.k.a. Holly Hot Damn was not an exception. Any chance you may have to visit him in the bar or her onstage, it's well worth your time.




San Francisco, CA---The Horizons Foundation recently awarded New Village a \$4,000 grant to support the agency's social marketing campaign targeting African-American gay and bisexual men. New Village, formerly Brothers Network, will launch a visibility campaign to reinvigorate prevention efforts and encourage those living HIV/AIDS to access treatment and care prior to the onset of the disease. The campaign, a model of community wellness, arrives at a time when the San Francisco AIDS Office projects that 16% of those living with HIV infection in the City are African-American, nearly double the percentage of the entire Black population in San Francisco. Of this figure, 74% are gay and bisexual men, including gay and bisexual IV drug users. This rate of infection shows a continually rising sero-prevalence rate of 59% for this same population.

Gay Men Can't Touch NY's Public Agency, MTA, Bans Gay Ad

Los Angeles--Movo Media, Inc., one of the nation's largest telephone dating services, has stumbled upon a solid wall of resistance to their gay-oriented advertising efforts by the New York Metro Transit Authority's outdoor agencies. The advertisement, which features a male couple embracing, was turned down by the MTA as unacceptable. Placement was scheduled for the heavily gay areas of Chelsea and Greenwich Village.
