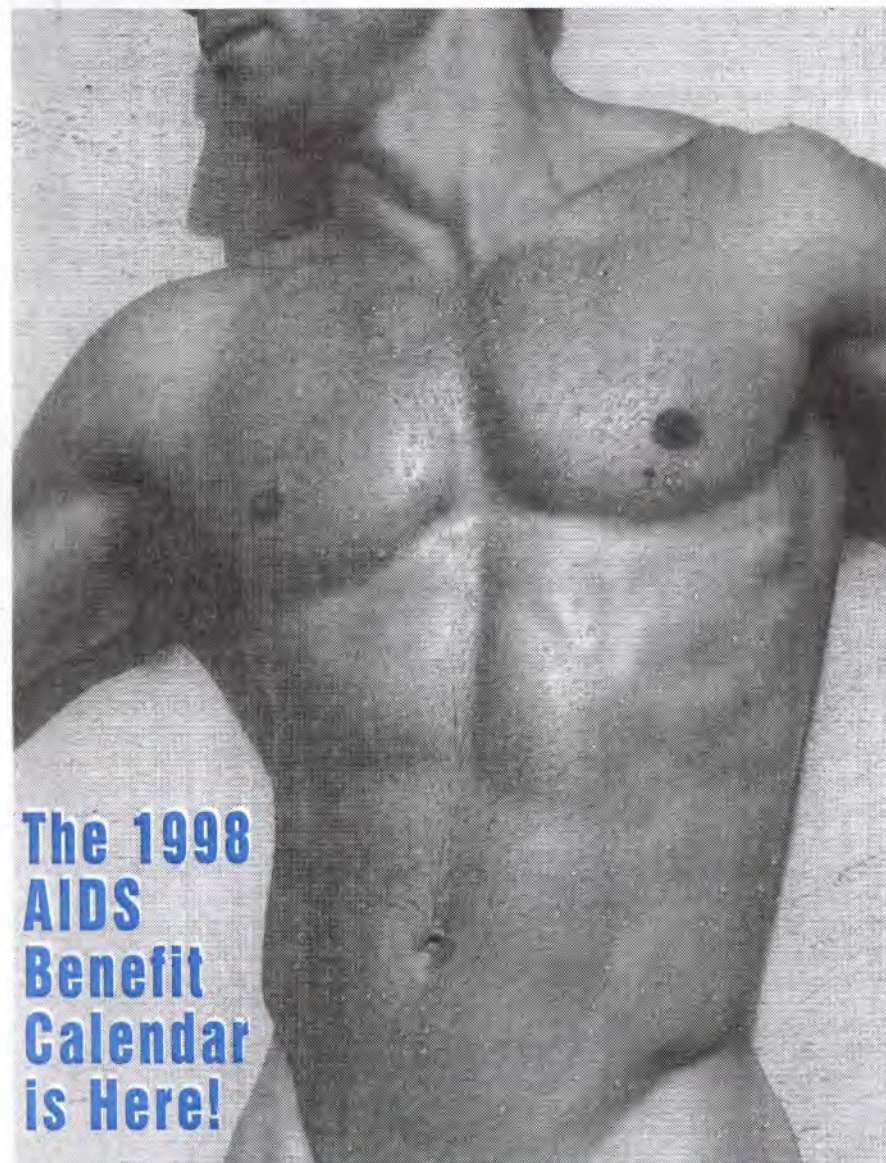

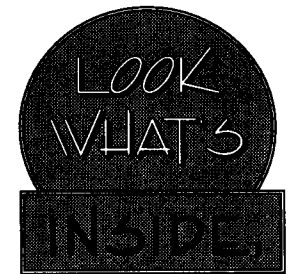

PAST/OUT

October 31, 1968 (29 years ago this week): Ramon
 Navarro is found murdered in his Los Angeles home.

Who was Ramon Navarro?

One of the most interesting gay Hollywood
 lives came to an end the night before
 Halloween in 1968 when Ramon Navarro,
 screen legend who once rivaled Rudolph
 Valentino, was murdered in his Los Angeles
 home.

Born Jose Ramon Samaniegos in Durango,
 Mexico, in 1899, the future star was descended
 from Aztec nobility and Spanish conquistadors.
 He moved to the United States as a 14 year old,
 and worked as a grocery clerk and cafe singer
 before breaking into Hollywood in a series of
 bit parts. The actor, rechristened Ramon
 Navarro, had his big break in 1922, when gay
 director Rex Ingram cast him as the villain in
 "The Prisoner of Zenda." At the time, America
 was experiencing a "Latin lover" craze because
 of Valentino's success, and Navarro was quick-
 ly cast in several more films. In 1925, Navarro
 played a shirtless, muscular galley slave in the
 silent version of "Ben Hur."

Publicly, Navarro was seen as a ladies' man,
 rumored to be linked romantically with Myrna
 Loy as well as Greta Garbo, with whom he co-
 starred in 1931's "Mata Hari" (Navarro was the
 one who uttered the famous line, "What's the
 matter, Mata?"). Newspaper and magazine
 writers promoted this heterosexual image,
 although some noticed another side of Navarro.
 One described him as "dark, stunningly hand-
 some (although his looks are somewhat effemi-
 nate) and seductive."

Navarro took few pains to hide his prefer-
 ence for men, however. One writer described
 how studio bosses had to "look the other way
 when Navarro made a beeline for the electrician
 with the tightest trousers." The star struck
 up a friendship/romance with Valentino, who
 presented Navarro with a black, lead, Art Deco
 dildo in 1923 with a silver inscription of
 Valentino's signature. Navarro also threw the
 wildest sex parties in Hollywood, often tied to
 current movies. For example, guests at
 Navarro's "Ben Hur" party wore nothing but
 Roman sandals and leather headbands. At his
 "Tarzan" party, the guests wore only leopard-
 skin wristbands, while their host (clad only in a
 leather thong) swung back and forth on a vine
 hanging from the ceiling.

But Navarro's stardom was not to last. In
 the early 1930s, MGM mogul Louis B. Mayer

demanding that the gay star marry,
 and when he refused, Navarro found
 his contract canceled. He played
 few roles in the 1940s, and in 1950
 went to Rome where he was granted
 an audience with the Pope. He pro-
 claimed his intention to beg forgiveness of his
 sins and pray at holy shrines throughout Italy.
 This religious phase was short-lived, and he
 returned to Hollywood to take bit parts (includ-
 ing his last role as a Mexican bandito on TV in
 1968).

By 1968, Navarro was a 69-year-old fat,
 bald alcoholic living in Los Angeles' Laurel
 Canyon and spending his money on hustlers he
 would pick up on the Sunset Strip. His wealth
 was legendary among the rough trade set, many
 of whom had no idea Navarro was even an
 actor.

Two brothers, Paul and Tom Ferguson, who
 had run away from Chicago, were living on the
 streets in Los Angeles turning tricks and steal-
 ing. They heard Navarro had \$5,000 hidden in
 his home, and they hoped to steal that cash and
 use it to return to the Midwest. On October 30,
 22-year-old Tom and
 17-year-old Paul arrived at Navarro's home and
 found the actor nude and passed out from
 drinking.

As the brothers searched the home for valu-
 ables, especially among the screen legend's
 hundreds of souvenirs from his film career,
 Navarro awoke and
 shouted for help. The Fergusons then began
 attacking him, and Paul grabbed an ivory-
 tipped cane and struck the former star repeat-
 edly with it. In an attempt to muffle Navarro's
 screams, Tom grabbed another of Navarro's
 souvenirs and shoved it down the actor's throat.
 It was the black dildo Valentino had given him
 almost forty years earlier.

Soon Navarro was dead, and the Ferguson
 brothers realized they had to plant some mis-
 leading clues to avoid being caught and tried
 for murder. They trashed the house, tied
 Navarro's body up, wrote the name "Larry" in
 several places in the house, and scrawled the
 following message on the mirror: "Us girls are
 better than fagits."

This feint was less than successful, especial-
 ly since they stole two of Navarro's outfits and
 left their own blood-soaked clothes in a neigh-
 bor's yard. A few days later, they were arrested
 and charged with murder. They were convicted
 and sentenced to life in prison, but freed on
 parole just seven years into their sentence.

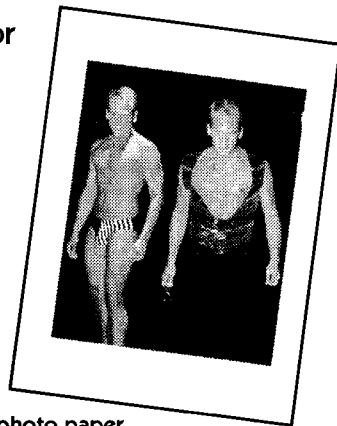

However still, this book is a classic guide to help parents accept their children's gay/lesbian identity and to help them to acceptance to be happier adults and to help their child's relationships through the parents validation and acceptance.

Beyond Acceptance: Parents of Lesbians and Gays Talk About Their Experiences.

by Carolyn Welch Griffin, Marlan J. Wirth, and Arthur G. Wirth. Revised and Updated Edition: St. Martin's Press, New York 1986 & 1996.

This is the most up-to-date book out for parents to work through their gay child's coming out as

gay or lesbian. Based upon discussion and interviews conducted with parents belonging to PFLAG (Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays), a support and advocacy group with over four hundred chapters internationally, *Beyond Acceptance* provides parents with the comfort and knowledge needed to accept their gay children and build stronger relationships with them. It provides accurate, documented answers to the questions that surface after the initial shock and addresses such concerns as: "Is it a choice?" Can it be changed?" and "Did the parents 'cause' their child to be gay?" This book *Beyond Acceptance* is superior to Fairchild's & Hayward's *Now That You Know* in the area of including the most recent scientific data for "causality" of homosexuality - the author supports the biological, genetic, and hormonal factors as being significantly involved. In *Beyond Acceptance* the authors creatively divided "Religious Thinking in Transition" into four prevailing religious attitudes.

1. The Rejecting-Punitive Attitude
2. The Rejecting- Non-Punitive Attitude
3. The Qualified Acceptance Attitude
4. The Full Acceptance Attitude

Using information current to 1995, the authors

help us to understand how each of our Faiths perceive us as gays and lesbians. I believe *Beyond Acceptance* is a "must" read for anyone planning on coming out to their family. The chapter "Levels of Understanding" clearly point out that parents especially go through three levels of understanding with level 1 being "self-centered concern" where parents cannot give acceptance and are to preoccupied with their own grieving of their gay child's coming out. In the beginning, parents have a need to get control of their feelings while maintaining contact with their gay child. They describe this focus as "Level 1

of understanding." When parents are at that level, they direct their actions and attention primarily towards themselves. Easing their own inner conflicts is their prime goal. It may take months for a parent to get to Level 2 Understanding- "child centered concern." This is what the gay person was looking for in the beginning. It's important to not see rejection when parents go through Level 1 and deal with their own pain first. Level 3 is when parents become concerned for all gays and lesbians and their parents. The book ends like *Now That You Know* with a heart-rending chapter on AIDS & The Family. I strongly recommend both books for anyone planning on coming out to their parents - read them first and then give them to your parents. It will save you and your parents immense pain in achieving "beyond acceptance."

Book in Review

Now That You Know What Every Parent Should Know About Homosexuality

By: Betty Fairchild & Nancy Hayward: Updated Edition 1989 with a new Chapter on Aids and the Family Harcourt Brace Jovanovich Publisher: New York

This book was initially written in 1979 and clearly was the classic book for gays and lesbians to share with their parents to assist them in the coming out and acceptance stage.

The authors updated the book in 1989 by adding a two page introduction and a forty page chapter on Aids and the Family that was written in 1989. Also the bibliography is updated to 1989 and is a good over-view of the books that would be good to read for parents up to 1989. In many ways this book clearly still has a lot to offer parents of gays and lesbians. One of the most impressive recommendations is this quote on page 46, "Ask your children to teach you (how it is to be gay). How else are we going to learn? What is meaningful to your child must be meaningful to you." They go on to say on page 54 "We are continually indebted to Deke for his patience and understanding, and for opening our minds for what being gay means, and for the many helpful books he has given us. Both Ed and I feel comfortable enough now to be able to talk about our son's gayness with pride." The authors also state that change, particularly in the area of deeply seated and hidden as human sexuality has been in the American Culture, is a very slow process in that parents need patience and time to deal with their deep seated homophobia. These parents make it clear that whatever the homophobia that their particular gay or lesbian child has, the parents have that plus probably more and they need

help and patience to over-come those prejudice. One of the benefits is that each of the authors has a special contribution in which Betty Fairchild's contribution is having a gay son and Nancy Hayward's contribution is having a lesbian daughter. These two parents state emphatically, "Most of the parents we have heard from or about have moved beyond their initial heartaches, fears, and doubts; the attempt to see a new aspect of their gay child's life in a fresh and realistic perspective. All of us can learn from each other and we do, as we share our experiences and relate how we eliminated our old beliefs and attitudes. The practice of change, as many of us have said again and again, this one that has enriched our life and enhanced the awareness of ourselves, of our children, and of other people." Some of the weaknesses in the book are the attempt to discuss *What is Gay*

in which many of these hypotheses are attitudes and information that are from the 1970's. Today's predominant genetic predisposition theory is partially validated by these authors but is no-where near what the profession of psychiatry and psychology believes to be accurate today. I believe one of the important contributions of this book is the emphasis on how important parents are in validating a gay/lesbian child's identity as well as relationships and how much parents can contribute to an adult gay/lesbian child's life by just working hard at acceptance. Angels of Hope

Green Bay Angels of Hope Metropolitan Community Church to Dedicate "New" Building Nov. 16

Editor's Note: Reverend Ken Hull, pastor of Angels of Hope MCC Church (Green Bay & Appleton) speaks candidly with *Quest*. We think you will find his comments informative, interesting and thought provoking.

Quest: Reverend Hull, we understand there are some exciting things happening at Angels of Hope. Perhaps you could lay out the calendar for the next few weeks and share it with us.

Ken Hull: All right! We had our real estate closing for our new church building on October 15. We had our first Sunday morning worship service there on October 26. A great time of celebration then!

It's interesting to note Positive Voice met in our building (on October 20) before we did.

Q: Speaking of groups which meet at Angels, the word about the community is that Angels of Hope is also pretty much a community center. Is that true?

KH: Yes, it is. We do have an AA group which meets on Sunday mornings; we have another Monday evening AA group. Bay City Chorus is now having their Sunday practices at our church, (our own choir rehearses on Thursday nights with Eric as the director) and Positive Voice holds their meetings there, too; and any other group in the community....we'll make a way to have room for them.

Q: It's a simple matter of calling the church office, correct?

KH: Yes, and getting it into our schedule so we don't have a time or date conflict. In our new facility, we have the sanctuary and fellowship hall downstairs. So, actually, two groups could be meeting at the same time, if need be.

Q: We need to know the address of the new church.

KH: Okay, that is 3607 Libal Street; that about's three or four blocks on south of where highway 172 crosses Libal.

Q: If you were to go south on Baird in Green Bay, you'd find yourself on Libal?

KH: That's right; it turns into Libal Street.

Reverend Hull....on the Promise Keepers

Q: We'd like to ask you about your views on the Promise Keepers, which has been getting intense media coverage lately. What's your take on them, Reverend Hull?

KH: Well, I'm a little confused about them. After I listened to them on the TV of McCartney and others as they talk, why they sound like they're really a good situation as men come and promise to straighten

themselves up and go home and be loving and caring and leading in their homes. Yet, when I heard them speak about the gays and lesbians (of course, lesbians....pause....women aren't in it anyway). But, for the gays; well, yes, they need to reach out to us in love, but we gotta change our ways. So, certainly, it is not truly reaching out to our community and accepting us for the way God created us.

Q: So, is it fair to say you think they missed the mark on *Love One Another*?

KH: I think so. Their love is conditional.

Q: Reverend Hull, as MCC Church approaches its eleventh anniversary in Green Bay, tell us about your membership as it stands now and your plans for the future.

KH: Of course, we've been just growing and right



now our membership (excluding those who visit regularly) stands at 57. That's quite a move from about seven members as of two years ago, when we came here.

Q: Astonishing! Tell us about your Appleton church; is that moving as you had hoped and prayed?

KH: Yes, it's moving along. We have twelve, fifteen, twenty in our worship service there. It's growing. We've just been there since late May, so it is growing....it's kind of where we expected it to be. On October 19, there were 23 attending our Appleton service!

Oh, we also have an AA group which meets Tuesday nights at our Appleton facility.

Q: Let's assume, Reverend Hull, that one wanted to check out Angels of Hope and is thinking about joining. What does one do?

KH: Okay. Well, the first good thing would be to come and worship with us and get a feel of who we are and that type of thing. They could talk with me, and, basically, we have a videotape to share which gives a background - a history - of the Metropolitan Community Church. If they'd like to be a member, it is open to them. They probably need to take a little time to get to know us. The door is open! Come worship with us!

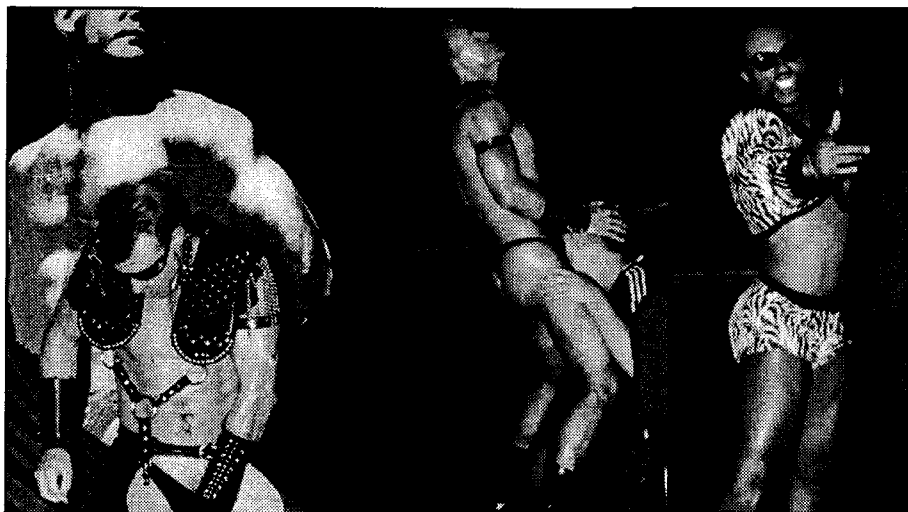

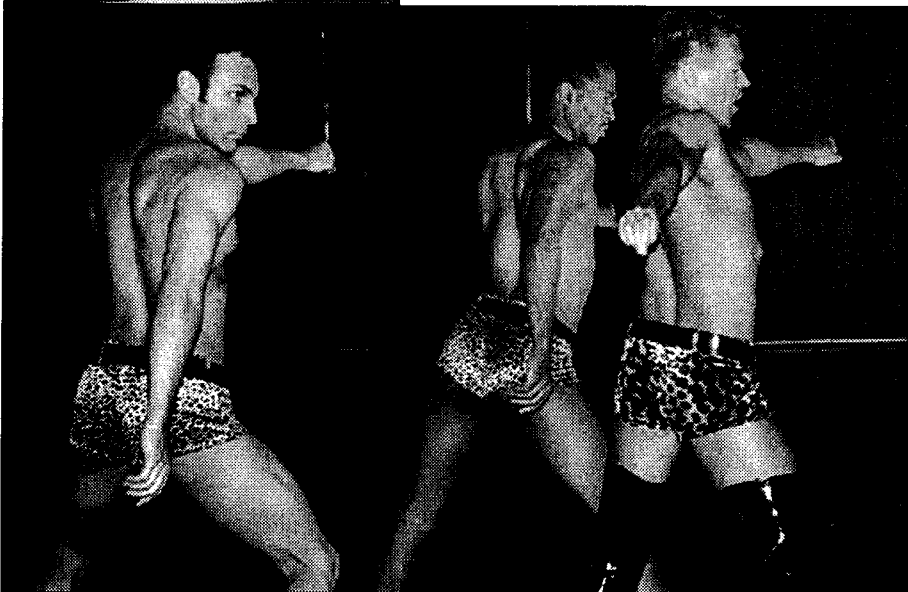
