PAST OUT

January 22, 1973 (25 years ago week): Norma McCorvey, a lesbian from Texas, makes constitutional history in *Roe v. Wade*.

Who was Norma McCorvey?

On January 22, 1973, the U.S. Supreme Court handed down a decision in *Roe v. Wade*, establishing a woman's constitutional right to terminate a pregnancy. Only a few people knew the true identity of "Jane Roe," the plaintiff in this historic and controversial case. *Roe* was, in fact, Norma McCorvey, a lesbian from Dallas.

McCorvey was born Norma Leah Nelson in 1947 to a working-class family. Ironically, her mother had wanted to abort her, which was illegal, but consulted the local back-room abortionist too late. Norma's father deserted the family when she was a child, and the girl suffered physical abuse from her mother. Angry and unhappy, Norma ran away when she was only 10 with a girlfriend, using money she stole from the gas station where she helped pump gas.

At a motel in Oklahoma City, Norma and her friend had their first lesbian sexual experience. When they were picked up by police several days later, Norma's friend said Norma had forcibly sodomized her. Norma was sent to a girls' reform school for that offense and for robbing the gas station. The reform school, McCorvey later wrote in her memoirs, was more of a home than she had had with her own family.

After her release at 15, Norma began working as a carhop at a drive-in restaurant. There she met Woody McCorvey, a smooth talker whom she married after a brief courtship. Their marriage proved almost as brief. When McCorvey told her husband she was pregnant, he beat her up and she left him to return home.

Though it may seem like an unlikely time to come out as a lesbian, it was during her pregnancy that the 16-year-old McCorvey discovered a local lesbian bar and began to frequent it. She found a home within the lesbian and gay subculture of Dallas. Though she had several relationships with women, she also continued to have occasional sex with men. After the birth of her first daughter, she came out to her mother and paid a price for her honesty - her mother was able to take her infant daughter away from her.

When McCorvey became pregnant again after a week-long affair, she carried the baby to term, but gave it up for adoption. But it was Norma's third pregnancy, from another casual fling, that made his-

tory. That time, she sought out an abortion but was unable to find a doctor to perform one. She tried unsuccessfully to abort with a homemade potion that made her sick.

Finally, an attorney she consulted about adoption referred her to two young lawyers who would change her life - Sarah Weddington and Linda Coffee.

Weddington and Coffee were feminists who wanted to build a case challenging Texas's anti-abortion laws, with an eye to setting a precedent that might overturn all existing abortion laws. Weddington had a personal stake in such a case - she had had an unwanted pregnancy when she was in law school and had an abortion in Mexico. In order to make their case, Weddington and Coffee needed a pregnant woman who wanted an abortion. Enter Norma McCorvey.

In February 1970, McCorvey was two-and-a-half months pregnant and desperate. She saw the two attorneys as her last hope for an abortion. When McCorvey met with them, she was honest about her sexual orientation and saw the confusion on the women's faces. Afraid they might not take on her case, McCorvey lied and told them she had been raped. Because she was concerned that her lie would be discovered later on, McCorvey opted to use the pseudonym "Jane Roe" for the trial.

McCorvey didn't understand the legal system, and Weddington and Coffee failed to tell their client that the suit would take too long to benefit her. By the time the case was tried and won, McCorvey was six months pregnant. She put her third and last child up for adoption. After a period of despondency in which she tried to commit suicide, McCorvey met her life partner, Connie Gonzalez, and got a fresh start.

Roe v. Wade was appealed by the state of Texas and went all the way to the U.S. Supreme Court. By a vote of 7-2 in early 1973, the justices held that a woman's right to an abortion was part of her constitutional right to privacy. It wasn't until 1987 that McCorvey revealed herself as Jane Roe and admitted her lie about being raped. A made-for-TV movie starring Holly Hunter was made about her in 1989, but with her lesbian identity left out.

After several years in the public eye, speaking out for abortion rights and writing a pro-choice memoir, McCorvey became a born-again Christian in 1995 and abruptly recanted her position on abortion. Since that time, she has been an outspoken advocate for Operation Rescue, the militant anti-abortion group.







LEATHER/FETISH

Happy 1998 to all and Happy 24th Anniversary to the Argonauts of Wisconsin.

I spent Christmas eve and day in North East Wisconsin with my son's and daughter's families (also my ex). Christmas at my vintage is related to enjoying the children and recalling fond memories through them. I am blessed with two beautiful (it's in the genes) children and 4 bubbling and energetic grandsons. I re-experienced, my childhood excitement of Christmas thru them. It was great.

I hope your Christmas was also.

If I haven't made it clear, I am a cynic. I will question any charitable organization asking for my money. And as it relates to the Leather Community, I will use this column to do the same.

I am put in mind of the time my mother, who, after watching the starving potbellied children with ribs showing, flies swarming at the mouth, noses and eyes, made a sizable contribution to the organization begging, only to learn that damn little of her donation got to that someplace in Africa. All of this as a lead in --

Last spring I wrote about the Argonauts of Wisconsin (AOW) (and the other legitimate clubs) not tooting their horns enough about their charitable efforts. I referred to the fact that State laws governing organizations that collect for charitable causes are designed to protect shysters from ripping us off.

(Would you believe, a person called the Quest Editor and complained that I was referring to him -- Was it Lady McBeth, I was put in mind of) ??? -

I digressed - - back to the AOW. About that time, the AOW started taking a hard look as where their fund raising efforts could and should go. The following (edited for brevity) will give you the history as well as the vision of this effort --

Thanks for the information - I have also taken the liberty of highlighting areas I feel important.

"Argonaut Charities" has acted under the umbrella of the Argonauts of Wisconsin (AOW) for the past several years. It has made small grants during that period of time in a total amount of over \$2000.

The AOW recognizes that there are a great many needs within the community, but has not aggressively marketed this fund due to the limited resources it had available.

With the creation of Argonaut Charities, the goal for fiscal 1998 is to substantially increase and maintain a sufficient level of funding to meet demands of individual in an immediate time-efficient manner.

It will further allow the Corporation to seek other grants as they become available.

As in the past with the old Center Project, Inc. "Emergency Fund", Argonaut Charities will maintain the philosophy that if the individual is able to repay all or portion of grant, the level of funding will be main-

tained.

The most important aspect to this philosophy is to strive to maintain a sense of dignity and worth on the part of the grant recipient. If no repayment is possible, future grants are not precluded.

The granting of emergency funds will be in accordance with the By-Law entitled "Purpose", and can be individuals or organizations. Requests that fall outside of the purpose statement can and may be handled by the parent organization.

Argonaut Charities is controlled by a Board of Directors who report on a regular basis to the AOW. The disbursement of funds to individuals is confidential. Only the treasurer and president will know the recipient. Checks are not to be written to individuals, rather to landlords, drug stores, etc.

The Corporation will meet on a quarterly basis and is comprised of the membership in good standing of the AOW. As a 501c3, contributions are tax deductible".

The second part.. "A Brief History of the Argonauts of Wisconsin and the origins of the Emergency Fund to the evolution of Argonaut Charities...

The organization is perhaps the oldest continuing membership groups in the State of Wisconsin. It was founded in 1974 in Milwaukee to bring together men of similar interests, specifically those who enjoyed the camaraderie of the leather/levi style.

Within a few years, the Argonauts moved its home base from Milwaukee to Green Bay and became the Argonauts of Wisconsin which allowed membership from throughout the state. This was an unprecedented move that had not occurred anywhere within the country. Perhaps this was one of the many innovations that our organization made and thus contributed to the evolution of the club scene.

The organization also takes pride in the fact that its membership as well as close friends of the organization were the founding members of Center Project, Inc. Additionally, it was the AOW that created as well as funded for many years the emergency relief fund for Center Project.

This fund was maintained as a segregated account within the general fund of the Argonauts. The organization initiated fund raisers and sought support from other financial agencies.

The organization recognized the need for a non-profit designation in order to raise the types of funds if we were to aggressively market the fund to a larger public base than what may be considered the more intimate community of friends and supporters.

Both organizations have and will continue to recognize the importance of a strong and unified community. It is our continued commitment as an organization to work for the betterment of our community and serve as well as promote the diversity it represents.

End of the edited message about The Argonauts of Wisconsin and The Argonauts Charities -- With all of the above in mind, I close this with the last sentence


