THE WIZARD OF OZ there's no place like home... review by Paul Masterson

The Skylight Music Theatre continues its fairy tale and fantasy themed 2014-15 season with a rare production of L. Frank Baum's *The Wizard of OZ*. Like many of artistic director Viswa Subbaraman's repertoire, the staging is a first for the Skylight. We all know the 1939 Technicolor film version. In a broader interpretation, it's about self-discovery, tolerance, and the loving safety and security of "home." For the LGBT community it has become a parable of its struggle for equality. Perhaps no other Oz character embodies the "gay" role than the Cowardly Lion. His signature song includes reference to being a "sissy" and a "dandy lion." He eventually finds his courage. The Scarecrow, too, delivers a subliminal message when he suggests "some go both ways." And, the Tin Man, well, he's just sentimental. All of this and more is captured in the Skylight's production.

Naturally, both in audience expectation and direction, there may be a tendency to revisit the film version. Here there may be some of that. But, smart casting, clever special effects and the vigorous and jazzy big band sound by a 10 member orchestra lead by music director Leslie B. Dummer make this OZ a new and exciting experience.

From Dorothy's opening rendition of "Over the Rainbow" to her return to Kansas, Susan Wiedmeyer gives a truly engaged and wonderful performance. She manages to be child-like yet resolute in her quest. Her vocals are nuanced, sincere and moving. The gangly and dangly Ryan Cappleman plays the Scarecrow as if the role had been written for him. Doug Clemens' Tin Man and Andreas Varela's Lion are both charming and sympathetic. All give well controlled comedy to their characters and sovereignty to their singing. Liz Norton plays the Wicked Witch and the spinster Almira Gulch with tempered wickedness and Susan Spencer brings earthy can-do to Auntie Em and a delightful airy goodness to the good witch Glinda. Rick Richter as The Wizard and Professor Marvel gives a very honest human touch to his bluster. Finally, Christopher Elst, as the Guard and Uncle Henry, rounds out the cast with swagger tinged with sweetness. Two different dogs play Toto during the run. On opening night, Hillie stole a scene or two.

The Skylight's production wizardry comes into play to underpin the performers' craft. The show's fairy tale effect rests in the lighting and set designs (both by Peter Dean Beck) that bring us through the scenes like illustrations in a storybook. The costuming (by Kristy Leigh Hall) offers enchanted singing flowers, crows, flying monkeys and curious, haz mat suited castle guards. Technical tricks include a very clever Munchkin realization. Pam Kriger's choreography includes an exuberant Jitterbug number that was excluded from the film version.

This is a perfect family show with an adult message that should put you in the mood to enjoy being home for the holidays.

GAMMA celebrates St. Nick's

Milwaukee GAMMA, the city's oldest LGBT social organization, celebrates its annual Holiday Party at *This Is It*, Saturday, December 6 from 1pm to 5pm. The event features a pot luck buffet, White Elephant gifts, and a special appearance by St. Nick himself. A slide show featuring GAMMA event photos by Paul Masterson will run during the party.

GAMMA president Bim Florek announced a special invitation to prospective new members. "We'd like to invite anyone to join GAMMA and enjoy their first GAMMA party. Anyone purchasing a membership (annual dues are \$36) at the Holiday Party will enjoy an extended 18 month membership through June 2016. Like other GAMMA members, they'll also receive a pair of drink tickets for the party," Bim said.

LGBT social and recreational group, GAMMA holds year round activities. Originally founded as a touch football group in 1978, GAMMA evolved over the decades. Ever expanding social, recreational and cultural profile, it now offers monthly parties, cocktail hours, hiking, bowling, biking and camping, as well as game and card nights, a din-

ing out group, theatre nights, a cooking group, an annual 4th of July picnic, and a wide variety of cultural and sports excursions.. They also staff a Health & Wellness Area booth at Milwaukee PrideFest and participate in the festival's Volleyball Tournament. "GAMMA has over 125 members and its events reflect the wide range of our members' interests. Any member can post on our Facebook page and announce an event and invite others to join in. Whether it's a game of cribbage or a trip to the Milwaukee Art Museum or the Bristol Renaissance Faire or a day of antiquing, it's all about finding fun and like-minded company to share time together," Bim explained. "We have organized activities or impromptu get-togethers. And, everyone is welcome," he added.

ONE OF THE LONGEST ENGAGEMENTS ON RECORD

On November 30th, Ross Walker and Erv Uecker ended one of the longest engagements on record as they were legally married on their 57th anniversary. Their wedding, performed at Pilgrim United Church of Christ, Grafton, was attended by several hundred people. Originally planned as a small private ceremony, with the encouragement of their minister, the Rev. Franz Rigert, it became a church wide celebration for the 800 member congregation. It was also the last wedding to be performed at Pilgrim as Pastor Franz will be leaving at Christmas, having recently been elected as the Wisconsin Conference Minister, overseeing 220 congregations.

Ross and Erv have been long time activists in the Milwaukee LGBT Community. Both have volunteered at the BESTD Clinics since 1985 and still serving. They were also the original founders of the Milwaukee LGBT Community Center, calling its first exploratory meetings and funding its origins.

They are currently residents of Alexian Village of Milwaukee, where they share a spacious apartment. Erv, an ordained minister, has conducted worship at Alexian and also at their beloved church home, Pilgrim UCC.





NEW ON DVD The Dark Place

The demands from Glenn's cinematic circle were simple enough. First, Glenn was to choose a film that didn't involve reading and that demand potentially extended to British films which were to be closely monitored. Given the number of recent evenings devoted to international cinema including last month's sexy Israeli film, *Snails in the Rain*, even Glenn could see the fairness in this request.

The second request proved even more daunting; not only was there to be no "reading," Glenn was to choose a film featuring a sexy gay twenty-something protagonist possessing hyperthymesia, a rare medical condition, one in which individuals can recall almost every day of their lives in near perfect detail.

What luck for Glenn, who just happened to have gotten a screening copy of **The Dark Place**, a dark and stormy new thriller starring Sean Paul Lockhart (aka Porn Star Brent Corrigan).

The enigmatic Keegan Dark (Blaise Embry) is the at the film's center. Long estranged from his affluent family, Keegan enlists cute Belgian boyfriend Wil (Timo Descamps) to join him in paying his mother Celeste (Shannon Day) a flying birthday visit. Still, surely something isn't quite right; his mother's birthday having been the month before.

How then, mused Glenn, had someone with perfect memory forgotten his mother's birthday? How, indeed!

Upon returning to the family home after a two-year absence, Keegan is plagued by the ghosts of past memories as well as by the decidedly flesh & blood Adrian (Andy Copeland), his mother's brand new husband and Jake (the above mentioned Sean Paul Lockhart), Keegan's nearly always shirtless new step-brother.

It is perhaps not particularly surprising that Keegan gets off on the wrong foot with his new

family Keegan and Wil have, after all, just walked into the home Jake shares with his father Adrian and Adrian's new wife unannounced. In the minds of some, Jake encountering Keegan (and Wil) for the first time with a baseball bat in hand isn't entirely unrealistic.

That Keegan takes an immediate dislike to Jake is evident but is he just being paranoid?

In fact, Jody Wheeler's entertaining if often convoluted screenplay has Keegan lead moviegoers on a right merry dance. Surely fuelled by his dislike of Jake, Keegan is convinced that his mother is in danger. Neither she, nor admittedly Glenn, is particularly persuaded by Keegan, however. Celeste prefers to be convinced of the devotion of her husband of six-months; well, of course she does.

Nor is she likely to begin doubting her new state of marital bliss when, entirely out of nowhere, Keegan attacks Jake as he whiles away a pleasant afternoon with Celeste, happily drying a few wine glasses and singing the odd bit of opera.

Then again, poor Keegan didn't bash in his own head whilst in the wine cellar nor is the near fatal mix up at the hospital merely an accident.

If you oh-so loyal **Quest** readers find this all rather confusing, so too were those gentlemen

Buy it, Rent it, or forget it...

Ever so sheepishly, Glenn must confess to being unfamiliar with recent films featuring Sean Paul Lockhart, the once and current porn star Brent Corrigan. The result, perhaps, being that Glenn proved quite surprised at how little the now beefy, muscular Lockhart resembled his charming Stan the Merman role in the otherwise excruciatingly awful *Another Gay Sequel*.

As entertainingly menacing as Lockhart's Jake undoubtedly is, **The Dark Place** in fact rests unsettlingly on Blaise Embry's performance and Wheeler's wobbly screenplay. In early scenes, there's a nice banter between Keegan and Timo Descamps' criminally adorable Wil, so why does Keegan continue to keep him in the dark? And yes, Glenn had to use that word. Why, too, is Wil so determined to stick by his complicated, uncommunicative boyfriend?

Once mother's in a coma, **The Dark Place** settles into a neat entertaining little thriller. There may be some huge leaps of logic, there are plenty in fact, but which Glenn only became aware of on a second viewing. Allison Lane is delightful as Sheriff Timmer, blissfully unaware that the "woman's touch" she so proudly brings to the job (brownies, indeed) won't amount to a hill of beans in a gay thriller such as **The Dark Place**.

The Dark Place is a must for Sean Paul Lockhart enthusiasts and fun for anyone looking for a sexy gay thriller, sans subtitles.

For now, however, let's hit the Bitchin' Kitchen for some crispy Christmas cookies. Here, you'll find a basic cookie dough you can turn into two cookies. One dough, two cookies—what could be easier? I don't know, but it's time to eat good and shut up!

RUTHIE'S BITCHIN' COOKIE DOUGH

Christmas cookies are a snap with this simple recipe. Just mix up a batch of my Bitchin' Cookie Dough, and then make the Simple Christmas Slice Cookies and German Chocolate Cookies. It's that easy! One dough...two cookies. Consider this my little holiday gift to you.

**2 cups butter, softened
1 cup sugar
1 teaspoon almond extract
1/4 cup sweetened condensed milk
4 cups all-purpose flour
1/8 teaspoon salt**

Using an electric mixer, cream butter and sugar until fluffy. Beat in the extract and the sweetened condensed milk.

In a large bowl, combine the flour and salt; gradually beat into the creamed mixture until well combined and a dough forms.

Divide dough into five 1-cup portions, rolling each portion into a log, 8-inches long. Wrap each log in plastic wrap and refrigerate for 1 hour. Use dough in Simple Christmas Slice Cookies and/or German Chocolate Cookies.

Ruthie's Sticky Note: If making the German Chocolate Cookies the same day, simply set 2 cups of dough aside and proceed with that recipe. Roll and wrap the remaining the dough for future use or for Simple Christmas Slice Cookies

Ruthie's Culinary Clues

You can freeze the dough logs for up to 3 months which is great for last minute needs, late-night snack attacks, etc. Swap out the almond extract with peppermint if you'd like...but note that the peppermint dough will not work when using the dough with German Chocolate Cookies.

SIMPLE SLICE CHRISTMAS COOKIES

These crunchy little cookies are addictive...and easy! Try them with a cup of coffee, some milk or vodka. No..I'm just kidding. I mean, who has coffee with cookies?

**3 cups Ruthie's Bitchin' Cookie Dough
Jimmies, colored sugar, frosting optional**

Take the dough out of the refrigerator for 5 minutes to soften for easy, consistent slicing. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Using a serrated knife, slice dough into 1/2-inch slices and set on baking sheets spritzed with nonstick spray. If decorating with jimmies or colored sugar, do so now.

Bake at 350 degrees for 10 to 15 minutes or until edges are lightly browned. Cool for 2 minutes before removing to wire racks. If decorating with frosting, do so once cookies have cooled completely.

Ruthie's Culinary Clues

Lining cookie sheets with parchment paper prevents burning and makes cleanup a snap. If your cookies are spreading too much when baking, it might be because the baking sheet is too warm from the last batch. Rinse sheets off in cold water and dry between batches if necessary. Cooling racks not only help cookies cool faster, but they help keep the texture of the bottom of the cookie in tact.

GERMAN CHOCOLATE COOKIES

Yum! No one will believe these cookies came from the same dough as the slice cookies also seen here. These are crunchy cookies that make great additions to holiday platters.

**2 cups Ruthie's Bitchin' Cookie Dough
3/4 cup flaked coconut, toasted
1/2 cup graham cracker crumbs
1/2 cup miniature semisweet chocolate chips
1/4 cup sweetened condensed milk
Chocolate frosting
Chopped pecans**

If necessary, take the dough out of the refrigerator for 10 minutes to soften. Combine the dough, coconut, cracker crumbs, chocolate chips and milk in a large bowl. Cover and refrigerate for 1 hour or until easy to handle.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Drop dough by rounded 1/2 tablespoon onto baking sheets spritzed with nonstick spray. Bake at 350° for 15 minutes or until edges are lightly browned. Cool for 2 minutes before removing to wire racks. Frost cooled cookies and top with nuts.

Ruthie's Culinary Clues

Toast coconut in a skillet over low to medium heat. Keep stirring until coconut is brown and crunchy. Feel free to omit the frosting and pecans if you'd like. They cookies great with a dusting of powdered sugar or served plain.



