Quest discovered this month's cover model, Kevin Ott through a friend. Kevin is very active on social media and one look at where he was taking his body and we were interested in a photoshoot. A second photoshoot was scheduled and in the meantime, Quest publisher Mark Mariucci became more acquainted with this highly motivated young man. We asked Kevin to put down in words his reasons for changing his life and becoming committed to improving his body.

Kevin traces the roots to this journey all the way back to high school. "I was always that guy who wasn't 'sexy' in shape but I was in shape enough

to be called... fit I guess," said our cover model. Kevin like a lot of youth today went down the wrong path; drugs, alcohol, smoking, being that kid who was a wannabe gangbanger. This landed him in jail several times within the course of a year. "I completely ruined my life and hit rock bottom," he says.

"One day. I looked at my younger brother and noticed he was in better shape than I was! I took a selfie shirtless next to him and was ashamed with myself. How could my YOUNGER BROTHER be in better shape than I am? I stood in front of a mirror the next day and said to myself this needs to change! So I got down there on the spot and did

as many pushups as I could and as many sit-ups as I could without stopping. It was only 30 push-ups and maybe 50 sit-ups," he said. Kevin then decided to make a plan including quitting smoking, 20 pushups and 20 sit-ups every day for 2 weeks. He planned to move up to 30 and do that for 2 weeks and move up another 10, etc. "I did this for almost 2 and a half months and I was up to 90 pushups and 90 sit-ups every day! After just 1 week I was seeing results. My muscles were starting to tighten up and I felt more energized!"

Browsing Facebook one day he came across a "click bait" story of a "kid who got bullied everyday and *"what he did next would amaze you"*. He dealt with all the ads to give it a read. It was about a kid named David Laid who used to be literally skin and bones, how everyone used to call him chicken legs. Even his hockey coach picked on him. He discovered he had Scoliosis and would need to go through physical therapy to maintain a naturally curved spine. The boy took working out a whole new level dedicating his entire life to it. He quit sports, started eating right, and dedicated all his free time to personal fitness. From 14 years old to 17 years old he completely transformed his body. He has a **Youtube** video called **David Laid 3 year body transformation** a collage of videos/photos of his body transformation over the 3 years.

Kevin copied what David did; just going on **Youtube** looking up home chest workouts and home ab workouts doing basic calisthenics. "After

1 video I was feeling more pumped and more physically exerted than I ever had in my entire time of doing the push-ups and sit-ups. But there was still a word in that article that caught my eye that I wasn't familiar with. What was calisthenics?, Kevin said. His research online came across a video of a 1 year transformation of a guy who transformed his life and his body with calisthenics after 1 year. Like David he was a twig. Nothing too special to his body, but after 1 year it was incredible. "He was defying gravity hanging from poles, doing muscle ups like they were nothing and doing workouts that most people would see and would be absolutely astonished with what they were watching. This was all after just 1 year!, an amazed Kevin states.

He decided this was what he wanted. To have that full body control and be shredded. To be the most he could be. "I searched calisthenics on **Youtube** and came across Brenden Meyers. Before I continue, I do not recommend any of his calisthenics workouts for beginners because the stuff he puts out there is insane, however look him up as he gives some amazing tips to people just getting started in calisthenics."

There are 2 types of main workouts when people think of working out. Aesthetics is weight lifting, curling, benching, squatting, anything to do with weights. Calisthenics is complicated body movements which is nothing but bodyweight training. You are training with nothing but your own body weight. Pullups, pushups, situps, and everything in



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between and various styles of each.

"I started doing calisthenics every day and after the first workout I was mind blown. I was struggling and barely finished the workout! I was sore the next few days but I loved it! I pushed myself harder and harder every day! I posted all over my social media about my progress, my snapchat, facebook, and my instagram. I couldn't believe it. People were following me and loving what I was doing with my life! From rock bottom to a superstar!"

People messaged Kevin and snapchatted telling him how much of an inspiration he was to them and how in the last few weeks/months that they've been losing weight or building muscle. Kevin got his cousin into it and he's had a complete body transformation and they are continuing to rise up together.

"Working out is also the biggest and healthiest stress reliever out there. You will never hear a story of a guy/girl walking out of a gym depressed. They always feel refreshed and invigorated!"

Kevin was able to quit smoking because this was his stress outlet. He also sobered up completely while transforming his body!

Motivated by feedback posting progress over social media he decided this is what he wants to do with his life.

"I want to help people change their lives just like I did. I hope to become a personal trainer, for now, I help anyone who wants to get started for free! I customize workouts for them to do and keep in touch! I hope to start a worldwide fitness movement so people with common interests and goals can come together to unite and find camaraderie and companionship amongst others with similar goals and interests as them. It all comes with time and patience. You will not see results overnight. You just have to push yourself past the limits that you think are possible."

SENATOR FRANKEN COMES TO MILWAUKEE ON PRIDE WEEKEND...BUT NOT TO PRIDEFEST OR THE PRIDE PARADE

Who was the wit who scheduled firebrand Senator Al Franken (D-MN) at Boswell books on PrideFest and Pride Parade Sunday, June 11 at 1 pm? According to the blurb, it's a book signing, no talk, "no posed photos" allowed and is limited to 500 attendees. The cost is \$30 and includes a copy of his memoir "Al Franken, Genius of the Senate", fees and taxes.

It would seem a proverbial "no brainer" to somehow take advantage of the occasion and bring Senator Franken to PrideFest or, even better, in solidarity with the Washington D.C. Equality March, to the Pride Parade. In fact, as an iconic

ally for LGBT rights, he should have been its Grand Marshall. Franken was, after all, a leader in the fight against "Don't Ask Don't Tell" and for marriage equality among many other causes. He introduced legislation to protect LGBT students from bullying. He voted against Education Secretary Betsy DeVos in part due to her opposition to protections for those same LGBT students. He also specifically called her out for her funding of organizations that support gay conversion therapy.

Yet seemingly, his visit, aside from the bookstore's announcement, is happening completely under the gaydar. Granted, Senator Franken's



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schedule may not have permitted a longer stay. He may be flying in and out in the course of the day. But, especially now in these perilous times of ever increasing threats to LGBT rights and to those of other minorities, it would seem incumbent upon our leadership to pay attention. One can

easily imagine the positive impact of such a celebrity visit on Milwaukee PrideFest or the Pride Parade, or, better yet, both. Somehow, with some effort and forethought, it could have been a coup for the city's LGBT community and perhaps sharpened our dulled political senses. Oh well...

CONVERSATION WITH ELLEN KOZEL OF VETERANS FOR DIVERSITY

A Milwaukee based organization, Veterans for Diversity, was founded prior to the rescinding of Don't Ask Don't Tell as a means to support LGBT veterans and their families. Today it's known for its Ceremonial Color Guard at PrideFest. Its members staff an information booth at that event's Health and Wellness Area. But the group is actually responsible for a much greater impact beyond its own community.

QUEST spoke with Ellen Kozel, one of the founding members of Vfd, about its current mission and the need for LGBTQ+ services for our veterans.

QUEST: Veterans for Diversity was founded well before 2011 when President Obama rescinded the infamous "Don't Ask Don't Tell" program in the US military that allowed LGBT individuals to serve in the armed forces provided they remained closeted. In fact, your organization was originally called "Veterans Do Ask Do Tell. What did Vfd accomplish in those early years?

Ellen Kozel: We began our outreach to the underserved LGBT veterans in a number of ways. We recognized them for one thing. We also taught the Veterans' Administration (VA) about the exis-

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tence of LGBT veterans and their specific needs. That helped opened the door for the VA to show they are LGBT friendly.

QUEST: And, with the increasing needs of veterans, especially of the ongoing Iraq and Afghanistan wars, how does VfD continue its mission now that gays can serve?

EK: The organization continues to expand its reach to all former service members. No veteran is ever turned away. We now work within the community and beyond. In the next weeks and months we will participate in several upcoming retreats and other events where VfD is collaborating with a broad spectrum of partners. For example, on June 16, the 2017 VA Mental Health Summit On the Holistic Care of LGBTQ+ Veterans takes place. The VA is working in conjunction with the Military & Veterans Resource Center at UWM with various service and social organizations like VfD to provide LGBTQ+ veterans with resources and access to information about programs available to them. We'll have a booth at the VA's 150th Anniversary celebration on Saturday, June 23 and on June 25th, the Center for Creative Learning hosts *Healing Warrior Hearts* with our support. There's also a Healing Retreat from August 18-20 and all LGBT veterans are welcomed to attend. Its program is specifically designed to address the health issues of LGBT veterans who served under "Don't Ask Don't Tell". They still experience problems. The retreat will also address the continued discrimination against active LGBT military and veterans.

The retreats are not held in a classroom environment. There's a lot of interaction between the veterans and facilitators who lead the retreat. I've been doing retreats since 2008. They've helped me with me with my own issues.

QUEST: What are the main concerns of LGBTQ+ veterans?

EK: There's a full spectrum from mental and physical health issues and access to treatment to employment issues like job training, as well as family matters. Today there are also concerns about the current political environment that is not friendly to any minority. Everyone is concerned not only about the future of the country but the military, especially. The Republican proposed health care plan is a perfect example. That plan, if passed, will cause the loss of health care benefits to thousands of veterans, if we don't start responding now.

QUEST: It sounds like VfD has been successful in pursuing its mission.

EK: We have but there is so much left to accomplish. We began here in Milwaukee and are the national headquarters. We now also have a branch in Dallas, Texas. Interestingly, they are much more organized than we are here. The organization in Texas is also more diverse. Forming a group that is diverse is a means to attract members. For whatever reason, we have not been as successful in that aspect. But we are working on it. We're a member of the LGBT Chamber of Commerce, for example. And, we are looking to create an advisory board to look out for the needs of millennium veterans and to develop members programs for Iraq and Afghanistan wars veterans. All in all we have accomplished a lot for our veterans and will continue to do fight for them. They deserve our thanks and support.

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"Handsome Devil"

For many of the gentlemen who compose the monthly cinema circle, their "Wonder Years" and beyond were often a time spent buried in the closet, feeling every bit the outsider. Even after the distance of decades, many continue feel a void; stories offering a narrative which includes the out & proud youthful protagonist going the Prom with their boyfriend, perhaps with the oh-so handsome quarterback of the football team, prove irresistible.

If he's being honest, loyal *Quest* readers, Glenn rarely finds such stories irresistible, seldom reading any of the now nearly endless variation of the gay coming-of-age novels which seem to have exploded on the shelves of Glenn's local LGBT Bookstore.

Gay cinema, too, has been similarly dominated by coming-of-age stories, from such classic offerings as *Beautiful Thing* and André Téchiné's enchanting *Wild Reeds* to such recent releases as *Akron* and *Henry Gamble's Birthday Party*. Another title to add to the list is writer/director John Butler's charming Irish coming-of-age film, **Handsome Devil**.

As **Handsome Devil** opens, Ned (Fionn O'Shea) is on his way back to boarding school; try as he might, he is unable to talk his recently widowed father (Ardel O'Hanlon) and his new, totally disinterested stepmother (Amy Huberman) out of dumping him at a school where the game of rugby not education, is held most high.

Anxious to head back to their comfortable lives in faraway Dubai, Ned's parents merely preach to Ned the virtues of conformity and off they go; nary a fatherly handshake or even the drop of a single

John Butler doesn't break new ground in **Handsome Devil** but that doesn't make this sweet, often very funny coming-of-age film any less enjoyable.

At the very heart of **Handsome Devil** are charming performances from Fionn O'Shea and Nicholas Galitzine. Glenn particularly liked the fact that O'Shea's Ned is not only strong enough to hold his own with the school's bullies, he's willing to stand up for himself. Indeed, Nicholas Galitzine's Conor here proves to be the sensitive one, the pain of the long buried secret is plain on his face as he seeks but doesn't find any answers when he reaches out to the closeted English teacher.

Andrew Scott is sensational as Dan Sherry, the unconventional English teacher. Determined to impart the message that everyone must learn to be true to themselves, Scott's English teacher recalls one of Glenn's favorite films, *Dead Poet's Society*. How effective that Butler's screenplay finds Dan also taking the message to heart, as he takes the chance of introducing his fellow to the Headmaster.

Rare for the gentlemen of the monthly cinema circle, but writer/director John Butler's fun and familiar **Handsome Devil** received unanimous high marks from all. **Handsome Devil** is a definite keeper!

With his shock of flaming dyed red hair, Ned is definitely an outsider, a fact that John Butler's screenplay effectively underscores with Ned's arrival at the school, where he is set against a sea of taller and broader classmates all already attired in the school uniform.

Ned is something of a variation of the familiar sensitive gay geek, rather more Ferris Bueller perhaps than *Glee*'s Chris Colfer. His nemesis, indeed Ned's "tormentor in chief," is a weedy lad named (nicknamed, surely) Weasel (Ruairi O'Connor). Perhaps because Ned outwardly seems content in his solitary

existence as well as Ned's unwillingness to show any signs of vulnerability, the other lads pretty much leave Ned alone, other than a few taunts of "faggot" here and there.

Ned's well-defined existence goes pear-shaped with the arrival of Ned's new roommate, Conor (Nicholas Galitzine), a star rugby player who has fled from another school under a dark cloud. Spying the shirtless, pouty-lipped hunk doing press-ups in what had been "his" room and certain that he is just another dumb jock, Ned wastes no time at all in heading down to the Headmaster's office to request a change but to no avail. Conor's request for a different, more compatible roommate likewise falls on deaf ears.

And what is Ned's solution? Quite simply, Ned divides the room in two by moving to the center, the dorm room's furniture, desks, bureaux and the like; very much a "Berlin Wall" in miniature. "All that's missing is the barbed wire," quipped one gentleman.

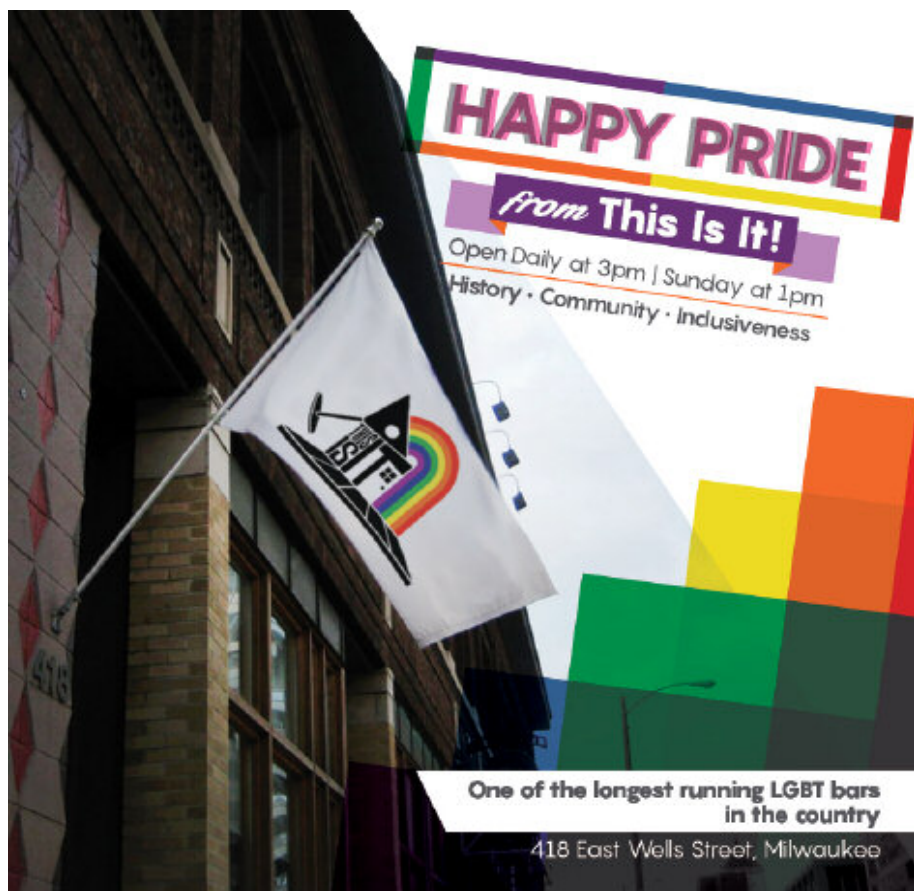
If Conor's arrival in Ned's room is initially quite ten-

uous, his appearance on the rugby pitch quickly becomes a huge success. Thanks to Conor's prowess on the field, the team has gone undefeated and is poised for a run to the championship finals.

Already becoming a hero to the student body rank and file, Berlin Wall or no, Conor tentatively reaches out to Ned. With a little encouragement from maverick English teacher Dan Sherry (Andrew Scott), Ned and Conor come to realize they just might have more in common than they first thought; a budding friendship slowly emerging.

Yet hero or no, there are those who disapprove of Conor's fraternizing with Ned. With the encouragement of Pascal (Moe Dunford), the homophobic rugby coach, Weasel and some of Conor's other load-mouthed teammates take it upon themselves to first tease him about his relationship with Ned and later give him an ultimatum.

Burdened by a secret which just keeps getting heavier and heavier, Conor disappears on the very day of the big game...

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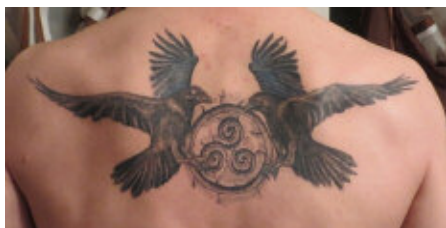


It's here! Pride is here! That's right boys and girls the fruits of PrideFest and the Milwaukee Pride Parade has come to bare on June 9-11 on the Festival grounds and on Sunday June 11th on South 2nd Street respectively. Make sure to mark your calendars so you can partake in all the fun they both have to offer.



The Parade will take place as always on South Second street stepping off from Greenfield avenues and head North to Oregon Avenue at 2:00pm on Sunday June 11th. Stop down and enjoy! Pride-Fest will be of course, and always, be located at the Henry Meir Festival Grounds from Friday afternoon through Sunday evening. And while your at both of those great events make sure to always thank a volunteer because without them and their hard work these events truly would never exist.

But lets get on with it. Your here to talk about body art....Let's talk about it. This month we are going to talk about tattoos!!



Tattoos have grown steadily in popularity as they have grown in acceptance in both social circles and the business world. Even in the counter culture world areas of the body once considered to be reserved for the "heavily tattooed" such as the face and hands have become much more common place in today's world.

Pride, and activism tattoos have become very popular incorporating rainbows into small tattoos

that traditionally had no color or other activism awareness colors. Semicolons have also become increasingly popular to bring awareness to depression, suicide, addiction and self-injury.

Tattoos can even identify hierarchy in sub groups, such as the case in the leather community where tattoos can identify Dominants and submissive and even what particular fetishes a person may be proficient in or seeking. For instance a slave might have a handcuff tattooed on his right side butt cheek to identify that he/she is owned while a Master might opt to have a set of keys tattooed on or ensure to only have tattooing performed on their left side to "flag" as a Dominant.

The caring for tattoos is very simple, father the tattoo is performed your tattooist will direct you to keep it bandaged for any where from 1-4 hours and then may or may not have you perform a general cleaning. From there aftercare techniques vary greatly from tattooist to tattooist. These styles can include using ointments such as A&D to lotions like Lubriderm, industry specific balms and lotions and even simply leaving the tattoo to "dry herbal" on its own. In any case always listen to the provided aftercare and contact your tattooist at the first sign of concerns.



In general tattoos can, and are, everything to everyone just like pride. Pride is what you make it.
